Nigel and I are planning to again hold Hannah's day in 2007. For those of you not familiar with the event it's in memory of my mother who loved to keep in touch with everyone she cared about. You may remember my mother's 99th and 100th birthday parties were held at The Crystal Palace public house in Berkhamsted. The new owners have kindly offered to let us have the use of their Public Bar for the day. (They'll have live music in the other bar in the evening which guests will be able to enjoy should they want to.) We'll buy nuts and crisps but won't be providing the usual spread so I'm also asking you to bring some food for the communal table. (Please check with me first to make sure you don't all bring the same things.) Don't worry if you can't bring anything though. It's you I want to be there, not what you bring with you. Each year's party has been better than the one before. Help make this year's one the same.

And in the true spirit of Hannah's Day, why not contact someone else that you don't see very often, just to let them know that you still think of them and care about them.
