WHAT HANNAH'S DAY'S ABOUT




2010 PARTY SPECIAL



If you came to our wedding you'll probably remember the Indian Drum Ceremony held in the evening of our special day. If you didn't you missed out on an absolutely amazing event - but now you can join in with not just one but two similar sessions, on Hannah's Day.

Taken by June O'Neil, everyone sits in a circle and either bangs or shakes something noisy to join in. June has agreed to hold one drum session in the afternoon, starting about 4.30pm and another in the evening starting between 7.30 and 8pm.

June will be bringing a few instruments, but doesn't have many, so if you want to join in please bring something to bash, shake or jangle. If you don't have a proper drum of your own you can bang an empty box or tin with your hands, or a mixing bowl with a wooden spoon. Or you can join in using a child's tambourine, rattle, or even fill a small box or jar with beads or dried beans and shake it.

If you are lucky enough to possess more than one real instrument and don't mind others using them, we'd be really grateful if you could bring them with you. (Make sure they're marked in some way to identify them as yours in case they get mislaid.)
